We are Story Tellers

This half term has been very exciting for EYES

We have been learning about traditional fairytales. First, we learnt what fairytales are about and then we read and studied wonderful traditional fairytales before



focusing on 'The Three Little Pigs'. The children loved immersing themselves into the story and built houses from construction materials and explored how to keep our houses strong. The children loved acting out the

We also looked and discussed the feelings of the different characters in our story 'The Three Little Pigs'. We did this through discussion of how the characters felt during the story and how the wolf could be a kinder character. We looked at the different materials used to make the houses and used our understanding of the world to find out which materials were strong and why. We were able to use a lot of our fine motor skills to cut out puppets, characters and created our own masks to help us sequence the story.





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
Year 1 Writing

We then had a go at answering questions about the books we have read and about the journey's they went on.










We are Writers

This half term has been very exciting for year 1!

We have been learning about traditional fairy tales. First, we explored what we already knew about fairy tales. We then read and studied wonderful traditional fairy tales such as: Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs, and Hansel and Gretel. We then moved on to our main text 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'., where we applied all of our previous knowledge and hands on experience to gain a better understanding of our topic book.

The children loved the interactive side of hot-seating where the were able to pretend they were different characters from the story. The children acted out the story and learned how to describe characters and scenes using adjectives. We discussed how the characters felt during the story at different points, and if they would do anything differently.

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Year 1 Mathematics





Over this half term, in Year 1 we have loved learning new vocabulary and equations in maths. We have used practical skills to develop our mastery and problem-solving skills. We started Autumn 1 by learning about place value and how smaller numbers make up our bigger numbers. We have also learnt how to use number lines to count forwards and backwards and we now use the words 'greater than' and 'less than' when explaining how we know.



This term Year 1 have used and applied their practical number skills to find answers, show working out and explain how they know their answers. We have used: numicon, cubes, counters and much more. We are also beginning to apply our reading skills to number questions and use these to read word problems.

We have now began our topic on addition and subtraction. Here we have gained a better understanding of the, add subtract and equals symbols. We have had lots of fun applying our knowledge to create number bonds. We are excited to learn about Geometry when we come back next term!



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Year 1 Topic

Geography

This term in Year 1, we have been learning about our local area. We have been using our directions, such as left, right, forward and backward to navigate around our local area. After we learnt about all

the different ways we could travel around we used our knowledge of directions to get to different areas around the school. We really enjoyed being able to take the lead and be in charge of leading all the children and teachers around the school to show them we knew our directions.

We have also been developing our map skills: what a map looks like, the different parts of a map and how to read one. After we had learnt about maps the teachers created one the children could follow to find the hidden treasure of Waverley School.



Science

In science we have been studying different animals including humans. We explored our senses and how they are similar/ different to other animals. We then moved onto developing our understanding of grouping animals based on their scientific features. To strengthen the children's understanding of animals, we took a trip to Twycross zoo where we saw herbivores, omnivores and carnivores and used our knowledge to help us during our Science lessons.

Outdoor Learning

The reception pupils have really enjoyed exploring our outdoor area this half term. Cooking food in the mud kitchen. Looking for buried treasure hidden by pirates. Riding bikes and learning to walk on the stilts. Engaging in a range of activities that support their physical development and gross motor skills. They have also really enjoyed using the large construction (crates, tires and wooden planks) to make obstacle courses.

Next term for Outdoor Learning:

In the EYFS we will take the children outside during all weather conditions to allow them to explore the changing seasons and talk about what they can see, hear and feel outside. Please ensure your child brings appropriate outdoor clothes (coat, hat, scarf etc).

If you happen to go on a walk during the half term holiday please be on the look out for acorns, leaves, conkers, nuts etc and bring these in for the children to explore while they are in the mud kitchen.

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


Phonics

This half term we have been exploring Phase 2 sounds. We have learnt how to blend words for reading. We have been doing this by hearing our sounds, saying them, reading them and writing. We have now moved on to writing some initial sounds in words and word blending to help us read words in books.

How can I help my child?
