Curriculum

At Waverley School, we challenge all children to achieve their full potential within our happy, nurturing environment. We provide a safe and stimulating environment in which your child can develop at their own pace, becoming curious, inquisitive and independent life-long learners.

Teachers promote a love of reading. The phonics programme in Reception is taught in a well-sequenced order. Books are matched well to the letters and sounds children know. This ensures children can decode successfully.

Our curriculum blends a mixture of continuous provision and formal learning. A series of half termly topics have been carefully selected to capture children's interest and spark their curiosity. Each topic will include a mix of adult led learning skills and concepts that are taught within the context of the topic and child led learning aspects that children want to explore further.

Children's personal, social and emotional development is at the heart of everything we do. From our transition events into Reception and to those that see our children move into Year 1.

In the Autumn Term you child's learning will center around the prime areas. This supports them in settling into their new school, forming new relationships, helping them to become happy and confident learners in all areas of the EYFS Curriculum.





Writing



The core skills of reading, writing and number acquisition are taught through structured sessions, where your child's individual progress is closely monitored.

Children are taught phonics twice a day, during which they learn the skills needed to read and write.

The teachers are amazing. Very supportive. My child comes home knowing new words all the time.

Your child will be taught to read using Sound Start phonics scheme. Reading underpins all aspects of our curriculum and welcoming, cosy book corners will support your child do develop a love of reading.



At Waverley, we place a strong emphasis on taking education outdoors often referred to as 'forest school'. It provides children a chance to explore the world in a non-classroom setting.



Our outdoor provision is open everyday in most weather types. Your child will be able to explore the world throughout the year in our mud kitchen, potting station and large water areas.



Bikes, large construction and climbing equipment provide opportunities to develop gross motor skills.

We teach children about road safety, outdoor survival and first aid as part of Waverley University.

Our environments are set up to act as an additional teacher. All resources are carefully selected for their academic potential, to support children's acquisition of new skills and challenge them to expand on what they know.





Moving On

Our children transition smoothly into Year 1. Children benefit from shared use of school facilities such as the school library, canteen and adventure playground. When it's time for your child to move into Year one, it is seamless and stress-free both children and parents.

I was nervous about my child moving into Year 1 but the teachers in both year groups made it easy. They held parent sessions about the transition and the Reception teachers visited my child in Year 1 to check in on them.

In Year one we build upon the enjoyment and enthusiasm for learning fostered in the Early Years. Pupils spend much of the day with their class teachers but as in Early Years benefit from the guidance of subject specialists in Music, Spanish and Physical Education sessions.

The curriculum is designed to broaden horizons and develop respectful, aspirational, independent learners.

The high-quality teaching children receive means that they are ready for the demands of the national curriculum by the time they begin Year 1. By the time they finish Reception Year, most have reached the necessary good level of development. This shows that they make impressive progress in Early Years.

Admissions Journey

Step 1

Come and visit us

We would love to meet you. Come and join us at one of our Open School sessions or arrange a personalised visit where you will meet our staff and pupils and have a tour of our facilities and grounds.

Step 2

Apply for a place

Applications are processed online through Birmingham City Council.

The application process starts in September and ends in July with offers being made in April.

Step 3

Enrolment at Waverley

Once you have accepted a place for your child, you will need to complete enrolment documents.

Step 4

Join the Waverley Community

Once your place is secured, you and your child will be invited to a series of transition events to help familiarise you with teachers, pupils and school before your child begins their Waverley Education.
