Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you once again for your unwavering support this half term. Our children continue to make us proud with their hard work, mature attitude and achievements. We have had a number of successes this half term starting with the Rock Concert in January where there were high energy workshops on diversity and respect. It was lovely to see all staff and pupils embracing the theme and thoroughly enjoy the day. Our chess players are going from strength to strength competing now in their second tournament – our pupils are demonstrating real skill and expertise. The choir have also excelled with their performance at Resorts World Arena taking part in the national singing project Young Voices. Pupils were singing along with 6000 other children and some celebrities including Natalie Williams, with the songs 'Extraordinary' and 'River Deep-Mountain High.' It was an exciting and overwhelming experience for the pupils and staff. There have been a vast range of educational visits and first-hand experiences. Year 1 pupils visited the National Space Centre where they were able to learn more about space exploration, see real life rockets, astronaut suits and a model of the International Space Station! Year 5 pupils have been immersed in history and heritage at Tamworth Castle whilst Year 6 pupils have been captivated by the pantomime Jack and the Beanstalk at the Hippodrome - the magical atmosphere of the theatre, coupled with the classic tale's reimagined brilliance, left a lasting mark on our young learners. Our Primary Newsletter will give further insight into the learning experiences and outcomes of pupils.

### **Parent & Community Partnership**

Thank you to those parents who have attended our coffee mornings – remember, there is one per half term and your engagement is important to us. Our Learning Mentors have supported parents in applying for household funds and in conjunction with the Dream Team Bed Poverty scheme supported families with bedding and beds. Keep in mind that the applications for beds and bedding will come to an end in March. As part of a NSPCC drive, 30 of our families/pupils from Year 6 have been allocated laptops to support them with learning and revision. Through Birmingham City Council – the Household Support Fund which is funded by the Department for Work and Pensions, schools have been provided with £20 supermarket vouchers for all pupils; these will be sent to all families before the end of this week.

Thank you to those of you who have attended our class assemblies, special STAR assemblies and workshops, your support is much appreciated. Next half term, we will be sending out a parent survey to gain further insight into your views and feedback. As always, this will support us in further strengthening the home-school partnership.

#### Ramadan

Many members of our community will shortly be following the religious observance of Ramadan. It is predicted to start around the middle of March. Whilst we would discourage the younger pupils to fast if your child is in Years 5 and 6 and you want him/her to fast please confirm this in writing to your child's teacher or by completing the section at the end of this letter. We are happy to provide supervision for pupils who are fasting and keep them inside to rest for most of the lunch break, but only if we have confirmation that this is your wish. During Ramadan it is important that all pupils maintain high levels of attendance and punctuality.

### **Parents' Evening**

Parents' Evening will take place on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> March and Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March. Details regarding this will be communicated early Spring 2.

### World Book Day

As many of you will know we are continuing to have a huge focus on reading across the school. We have invested in purchasing a number of reading books, online programs, phonics resources and our book vending machine all to further support reading. Reading is a high priority across the curriculum and school day. To support us further, can we ask parents to regularly ask their child about the books that they are reading in school and aim to continue this at home. We want all of our children to develop a passion for reading and a love of literature. Our celebrations on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March will further support us with this – all pupils are encouraged to dress up as their favourite character, create a 'book in a box' and meet the author Billy Bob Buttons!

## **Educational Visits**
